

KUMO RADEN


"Manu Propria" Fountain Pen

Kumo = Cloud, Ra = Mother of Pearl, Den = Sprinkle

This technique is achieved by sprinkling "migin" small mother of pearl particles into cloud like pattern brushed with "roiro-urushi" transparent black lacquer.

After application of many more layers of "roiro-nuri" the surface is ground flat to release the abalone particles on a flat surface.







IRO RADEN

"Manu Propria" Fountain Pen

Iro = Color, Ra = Mother of Pearl, Den = Sprinkle

This technique is achieved by sprinkling small "migin" mother of pearl particles into pigmented-urushi" Black "kuro", Red "Shū", Green "Midori", Blue " Ao" lacquer. After application of many more layers of the same lacquer the surface is ground flat to release the sparkling abalone particles on the polished surface





Technique TAME AOGAI MIGIN

Tame Aogai Migin is the term for a lacquer based on Abalone powder
Here fine Aogai Migin granulate is sprinkled onto wet black lacquer.
Many layers of black lacquer is applied before grinding andd polishing.
A final coat "Tame" of transparent "Sukurome Urushi" is laid over the polished surface and ground and again polished. The sparkling Abalone particles appear through the transparent layer in a rather reddish tone.

The advancement of the final coat laid over the aogai migin is, to provent the Abalone particles to fall off over the time as can happen once a while

USU-RADEN

Usu = thick, Ra = Mother of Pearl, Den = Sprinkle

TAME TAME RADEN

Ra = Mother of Pearl, Den = Sprinkle

This technique is achieved by sprinkling mother of pearl particles and larger pieces of shells and snails into "roiro-urushi" transparent black lacquer. Tame refers to the technique by allying a final coat of transparent urushi, which's brownish color changes the colors of the mother of pearl



RADEN

RADEN to KAI

"Manu Propria" Fountain Pen

Ra = Mother of Pearl, Den = Sprinkle, Kai = Shell

This technique is achieved by sprinkling mother of pearl particles and larger pieces of shells and snails into "roiro-urushi"





TAME RADEN


"Manu Propria" Fountain Pen

Ra = Mother of Pearl, Den = Sprinkle

This technique is achieved by sprinkling "migin" small and larger "usu" mother of pearl particles into "roiro-urushi" transparent black lacquer.

After application of many more layers of "roiro-nuri" the surface is ground flat to release the abalone particles on a flat surface

Tame refers to the technique by allying final coats of transparent urushi, which's brownish color changes the colors of the mother of pearl into yellow, orange and reddish tones.



Technique RADEN FUBUKI MOMIJI MAKI-E

Egg Shell Lacquer, called "Rankaku-Nuri", Tamago-Kara-Nuri" or "Keiran-Nuri. Fubuki = Lingering Snow In this Urushi Laacqueer version the egg shell lacquer contains Sparkling Raden particles and is additionally decorated with Maple Leafs "Momiji Maki-e"



Technique RADEN NEGORO

RADEN NEGORO - Negoro Nuri lacquerware with an undercoat of black lacquer

covered by a coat of red lacquer or vice versa used as vessels for food and drink offerings to the gods and buddhas, tableware and drinking vessels, tea utensils, and stationery came to be known as negoro. This term originates from Negoro-ji, a temple in Kishu. "Yô no bi" beauty through use is an important aestetic aspect of "negoro-mono". Here on this Negoro Variation Raden (Abalone) is additionally applied





Technique RANKAKU MOMIJI MAKI-E

Egg Shell Lacquer, called "Rankaku-Nuri", Tamago-Kara-Nuri" or "Keiran-Nuri. Fubuki = Lingering Snow This version is additionally decorated with Maple Leafs "Momiji Maki-e"
